General Information

- Box Office Opening Times: 9am-5:30pm
- Turnstiles (General Admission): 11am until half time of the final game.
- Corporate Entrance Times: 11am until 1 hour after the final whistle.
- There are no pass-out systems in place. If you leave the stadium, you will not be allowed re-entry.
- Cash Only Concourses & Car Parks Nearest FREE Cash Points located at Tesco and ASDA

Baggage Restrictions

Nothing larger than $8 \times 6 \times 2$ inches or $210 \times 148 \times 50$ mm will be allowed into Corporate Hospitality or General Admission areas.

There are no bag drop-off facilities on site. All baggage larger than the dimensions, must be stored in your vehicles. All baggage is subject to a bag search before entering the stadium.

Ticketing

Please enter the stadium via the turnstile indicated on your ticket.

Spectators must ensure that they sit in their allocated seat(s).

Although there may be adjacent seats that appear empty, it is likely that ticket holder hasn't yet arrived or is elsewhere in the stadium.

If a concession ticket has been purchased, identification may be requested on entry. Holders of such tickets should ensure that they have the appropriate ID with them.

Children under the age of 2 are admitted free of charge but must be issued with a ticket – same block but not necessarily in an adjacent seat, this is to ensure they have the same turnstile.

All sales and prepaid ticket collection from the Stadium ticket office.

Refreshments

There are food kiosks in the ground which are open before the match until just after half time. **All kiosks are <u>cash only</u>** and serve a range of hot and cold drink and snacks. Please be mindful if you are wanting to bring your own food into the ground as there are bag restrictions in place. No large amounts of food will be allowed into the stadium.

<u>Plastic water bottles are permitted inside the stadium but must be no bigger than 500ml and are limited to one per ticketholder. All water bottles will be subject to security checks upon request.</u>

Luggage/Pushchairs

Getting to University of Bolton Stadium

By Road:

From the East (Leeds)

If travelling West towards Manchester on the M60, leave at Junction 15 and join the M61 towards Preston. DO NOT take the A666 towards Bolton. Turn off the M61 at junction 6 and take the third exit off the roundabout onto A6027, the De Havilland Way. At the next roundabout;

- a. Go straight across for car park A.
- b. Take a left turn onto Burnden Way for car parks B, C and E

From the West (St Helens & Warrington)

If travelling East towards Manchester on the M62, leave at Junction 12 to join the M60 and follow signs for M62 towards Leads. Leave at junction 15 and follow the signs for M61 Preston, D0 NOT follow the signs for A666 towards Bolton. Turn off the M61 at junction 6 and take the third exit off the roundabout onto A6027, the De Havilland Way. At the next roundabout;

- a. Go straight across for car park A.
- b. Take a left turn onto Burnden Way for car parks B, C and E

From the North

If travelling down the M6, follow signs for the M61 and leave at junction 30. Once on the M61, follow signs for Manchester/Bolton and leave at junction 6 (University of Bolton Stadium should be visible on the left). Take the first exit off the roundabout onto the A6027, the De Havilland Way. At the next roundabout;

- a. Go straight across for car park A.
- b. Take a left turn onto Burnden Way for car parks B, C and E

From the South

If travelling up the M6, follow signs for M62 and leave at junction 21a, following signs for Manchester. Join the M60 at Junction 12 and proceed to follow signs for the M61 towards Preston. DO NOT take the A666 towards Bolton. Turn off the M61 at junction 6 and take the third exit off the roundabout onto A6027, the De Havilland Way. At the next roundabout;

- a. Go straight across for car park A.
- b. Take a left turn onto Burnden Way for car parks B, C and E

By Rail:

Please note there are no rail services going to and from Bolton or Horwich Parkway rail stations.

Match Day Parking

Match day parking will be available on a first come first serve basis, match day only. Spectators are asked to make their way to the Stadium and turn onto Burnden Way to find the nearest car park. Coach parking for Warrington Wolves and St Helens spectators are to use Car Park E and coach parking for Hull FC and Halifax spectators are to use Car Park A.

For spectators who have blue badges, there are spaces in Car Park C via Burnden Way or Car Park A via the A6027, De Havilland Way.

Parking is charged at:

- a. Cars = £10
- b. Mini Bus = £10
- c. Coaches = £20
- d. Accessible Blue Badge Parking = £10

Please note: Match day parking is cash only.

Please be mindful of and courteous to the neighbours of Bolton Wanderers Football Club by not parking your vehicles in the residential areas surrounding the University of Bolton Stadium.

Ground Regulations

- Spectators may be subject to random searches prior to entering through the turnstiles.
- Smoking within the Stadium will result in immediate ejection, including the use of e-cigarettes.
- Large amounts of food will not be allowed into the stadium. The amount of food allowed will be at discretion of University Of Bolton Stadium staff.
- No glass bottles or cans permitted.
- University Of Bolton Stadium are committed to <u>Zero tolerance</u> on obscene, racist and foul & abusive language.
- It is RFL policy that air horns or similar (vuvuzelas in particular) are not allowed to be taken into the stadium. Any instruments of this nature found inside the stadium will be confiscated immediately upon discovery.
- Sale of alcohol in GA areas to cease approximately 15 minutes into the second half of the final game or as gueues die down when they will close permanently.
- Beers, lagers etc. to be supplied in pint and half pint plastic glasses maximum 4 glasses per customer.
- The stadium rigorously enforces its "Challenge 21" alcohol policy. ID will be requested if purchaser appears to be under 21. Stewards will be looking for under 18's "sweeping" for alcohol on the concourses
- Alcohol is permitted for consumption in the stadium bowl
- Smoking within the Stadium will result in immediate ejection, this includes the use of ecigarettes. There will be a bubble area provided which will be sign posted. This area will open at half times and between games.
