VIEW FROM THE CLUB... JAMES ROBY

I didn't play last week against Huddersfield as I picked up a head knock during the game. I was out for a second or two, but opened my eyes and realised I was fine. I went straight to the changing rooms, passed the head assessment test with the doctor and there has been no issues since. However, given I was out for a few seconds plus the fact it was a short turn-around with less than 7 days until we played the Giants, I had to sit it out. I wasn't needed anyway as the boys played really well and it was a good performance.



It was nice to see a few young lads get their chance. At certain parts of the game, it was quite a young team, especially the back line and I thought they all did well. They made a claim for a jersey for sure.

I thought Az [Smith] played really well and took his chances when he had to run. Like me the week before, he took a bit of a head knock and it's actually good experience to get a bit of a bang, go and do your head checked, pass and come back on. It gives you a bit of confidence next time and I thought he defended really well too. It was good that he got a good amount of game time rather than coming on for the last half an hour or so. I am sure it will do his confidence the world of good and he keeps scoring tries now too – which I don't!

I was gutted for Doddy [Lewis Dodd]. He deserved to make his debut and I know a lot of people have heard his name and know what potential he has, but we see him day in, day out. He is a great kid with a great character and he has got a good attitude with the way he carries himself. He deserved his shot, but most of the lads spoke to him and I chatted to him afterwards. I just told him it was not his fault, it was out of his control and he was just unlucky. These things happen and it might happen to someone else moving forward the way the world is at present. If he keeps doing what he is doing, he will get another shot in a few weeks because he deserves it.

I watched Hull KR beat Wigan and they threw the ball around a lot! It looks as though they have been given free reign to a bit more risky, throw it around and almost force the pass now and again. When it comes off, it looks good and it is entertaining. They scored some good tries so we know after playing them the other week and after watching the Wigan game, what they are capable of and where their dangers are. We must be at our best and the main thing for us is to keep our momentum going. We are five from five now after the break and the main thing is not to get carried away, we must take it game by game. As the fixture list gets more and more busy, we are going to get tested and we are going to need our whole squad in those periods.

Q: You must be pleased with how you are playing at the moment?

A: I am really happy with how I am going at the minute. I am enjoying my rugby and that is hopefully showing on the pitch. As a team we are playing really well too and that is the most important thing.

Q: Have you nailed down your position now in the back row?

A: I think back row is definitely my position. I think it suits how I like to play and especially on that right edge, playing alongside the likes of Theo [Fages] and Kev [Naiqama], I think we are striking some nice combinations.

Q: Do you feel fitter and stronger now?

A: Yes I think the Lockdown really helped me. It allowed me to get a lot more weight training in and we all returned in good shape and I think you can see that in all the boys since the restart.

Q: Is there anything you have worked on personally to improve your game?

A: I think the main thing is my defence. I have just tried to make sure I am winning my tackles and I am solid and doing my job there. With my carries, I have been trying to make sure I get us on the front foot and winning the ruck.

Q: Have you enjoyed the talk about you from our fan base on the back of your performances?

A: It is always good to hear people talking about you when you are playing well. It has been nice, but I need to keep on improving and getting better each week.

Q: We face Hull KR again, who had a good win at Wigan recently...

A: We know how they want to play. They like to throw the ball around and that is their style and we saw that against Wigan last week. We know what we need to do and we probably weren't at our best when we played them so we know what we need to fix up to get another win.

Q: And we are top of the league again now. Is it about building more momentum?

A: We weren't happy where we were in the league before the Lockdown and it was something we obviously focussed on. We wanted to get back up there where we belong and we just need to keep working hard and hopefully we will stay there.

Q: We face Warrington in the Cup and then Wigan soon too. Are those the games you look forward to as a player?

A: Yes definitely. Those are the games you want to be playing in and hopefully as the season goes on we may get a few fans in too for those big games!

Q: And finally. Tell us about the moustache....

A: I did it for a bit of a laugh and I think it is going to stay because everyone seems to be liking it. If I keep on playing well, it will definitely stay!

OPPOSITION

A WELCOME TO... HULL KR

All roads lead to our very own Totally Wicked Stadium this week, as all fixtures are to be played in St. Helens. Saints are due to face Hull KR, for the second time in less than three weeks and will be looking to extend their run of five successive wins since the resumption of Super League XXV at the start of August. We are at the season's midpoint now and this year has certainly been like no other, in the 125 year history of our great sport.

Saints come into tonight's game on the back of a great win over Huddersfield Giants, last Friday. Rovers though; are still bottom; but they will be buoyant after their memorable defeat of the Wigan Warriors. The Robins were absolutely outstanding in their 34-18 triumph and they thoroughly deserved their win.

Rovers are only at the foot of the table because of the withdrawal of the Toronto Wolfpack team during the pandemic lockdown. But with the announcement that relegation has been scrapped in 2020, headcoach Tony Smith, has taken the shackles off his squad, reduced their structure and has seemingly told his team to go out and play football.

They were a little bit off the mark in their first game back after lock down against the Warrington Wolves and were comprehensively beaten 10-40, but they did trouble a very good Warrington side, who certainly knew that they'd been in a game. They were much better, next time out, against St. Helens, who have been very good since the restart, and more matched their opponents in a highly competitive first-half that saw the teams go in at half-time, level at 12 all. Saints were admittedly the better team, after the break, but Hull KR caused the Champions all manner of problems and the final 18-32 scoreline certainly flattered St. Helens.

And last Thursday, without the injured Adam Quinlan and Ben Crooks, Rovers were sensational against the then league leaders, Wigan Warriors. They totally out classed Wigan in every facet of the match. The Warriors had no answer to Hull KR's off the cuff, free flowing rugby, as just about everything they tried came to fruition. Not only did they show they could attack; their defence was also robust in a most pleasing victory.



During the off season there was a massive turn around in playing personnel with no less than 19 players leaving the club and 19 players recruited. Shaun Kenny- Dowall was their big named signing but Greg Minikin, Ethan Ryan, Jordan Abdul, Matty Gee, Jez Litten and Elliot Minchella are young names to look out for.

And as the new squad gelled, the early part of the season was tough, particularly as the threat of relegation was very real. Rovers won their opening match against Wakefield Trinity 30-12 at Craven Park, but then lost at Hull FC 16-25 and Leeds Rhinos 10-52. Two home losses followed at the hands of Huddersfield Giants 4-22 and Castleford Tigers 8-28 and the Robins were defeated at Wigan Warriors 16-30. The opening part of the 2020 season ended with a narrow home Challenge Cup victory over Leigh Centurions 22-19.

The announcement that Rovers' chairman, Neil Hudgell, is to leave the club at the end of the season has come as a huge shock to us all. The second longest-serving chairman in the club's history, Neil has overseen 13 out of 16 his years in the top tier of the British game. Rovers had been ten years out of the elite when he took over – and he has overseen massive ground improvements at Craven Park; notably the new Colin Hutton North Stand and the extension to the East Stand.

It was on 23 May 2004 that Neil Hudgell travelled to Batley for his first game as chairman of Hull Kingston Rovers. A 34-28 defeat at the hands of the Bulldogs was not a particularly auspicious start for him, and, at the time, it is doubtful that even Neil himself would have expected to be still in charge over 16 years later. But he still is, and he has been a huge character, not only in the history of Hull Kingston Rovers; but in the shaping of the Super League competition. This evening's game is his 499th as chairman of Hull KR, and next weekend, also here at St. Helens, there should be a huge celebration as Neil clocks his 500th match as chairman against Leeds Rhinos in the Challenge Cup. From us all at St. Helens, we'd like to congratulate Neil on all of his achievements at Hull Kingston Rovers and wish him all the very best for the future.

SHAUN KENNY-DOWALL

Shaun Kenny-Dowall joined Rovers from Newcastle Knights at the start of the 2020 season. He made his NRL debut for the Sydney Roosters back in 2007 and went on to become one of their "all-time great" players, scoring 123 tries in 226 appearances. A beaten Grand Finalist in 2010, he went one better in 2013, scoring a try in his teams 26-18 defeat of Manky, He joined Newcastle in 2017 and scored 18 tries in 53 appearances. Shaun has also scored nine tries in his 21 caps for New Zealand.

KEY STATS



KANE LINNETT

Scottish International, Kane Linnett was originally born in New South Wales, although the Aussie born backrower has featured for The Bravehearts six times. Linnett scored 31 tries in 51 games for the Dragons in 2008/09, before being scooped up by the Sydney Roosters in 2010. In 2012, Linnett signed for North Queensland Cowboys and went on to appear 164 times, scoring 53 tries. Acquiring Kane's signature was a massive coup for Rovers ahead of the 2019 season and he rewarded them by scoring 10 tries in 27 appearances in his first season with the club.



GREG MINIKIN

Greg joined Hull Kingston Rovers from Castleford Tigers at the start of the 2020 campaign. A prolific try scorer, the 25 year predominantly plays on the wing. He began his career at York and scored 20 tries in 39 appearances for the City Knights. Greg joined Castleford in 2016 and he went onto score 42 tries in 95 appearances for the Tigers and was and integral member their squad that reached the Grand Final.



JORDAN ABDUL

Jordan Abdul is in his second spell at Hull KR. Predominantly a Hull KR. Predominantly a Hull FC player. He played for the Black and Whites from 2014 to 2016 before joining Rovers – on Ioan in 2017, prior to returning to Hull FC in 2018. Jordan has scored 10 tries and 8 goals in 54 appearances for Hull FC and in his first spell with the Robins in 2017 he made five appearances for the club. In 2019, Jordan joined London Broncos and had an outstanding season with the club.



JEZ LITTEN

Jez Litten, aged 22, joined Hull KR in August 2019 from fierce rivals Hull FC. Hooker, Litten provides speed from dummy-half and he made 17 appearances for the Black and Whites following his debut back in 2017. Midway through last season, Litten joined Doncaster – on Ioan and scored two tries in the six matches, in which he played, prior to joining Rovers. Now at Hull KR, he turned out four times for the Robins last season.



ON THIS DAY: 11 SEPTEMBER

1905 Committee Meeting at Headquarters [Talbot Hotel, Duke Street]: "Resolved that C. Creevey be paid 10/- insurance for damaged fore-finger."


1909 Northern Rugby League: St. Helens 5 Runcorn 5 at Knowsley Road. England international forward Frank Lee scored the try; Charlie Creevey kicked a goal. The Saints wore their new all-black kit for the first time. The influence of the New Zealanders was apparent with this choice. There was a record crowd of almost 10,000 spectators. Runcorn in myrtle jerseys, known as the Linnets, were a strong side in those days.

1954 Lancashire Cup Rd 1: St. Helens 27 Whitehaven 6 at Knowsley Road. Right winger Eric Ledger flew in for 4 tries. He repeated the dose against Wakefield at Belle Vue seven days later!

1977 First Division: St. Helens 39 Castleford 17 at Knowsley Road. Scrum-half Ken Gwilliam, more renowned for his graft around the scrum-base scored a memorable hat-trick of tries.

1994 Stones Bitter Championship: Workington Town 25 St Helens 30 at Derwent Park. Never an easy assignment up there in Cumbria! Unusually, Simon Booth partnered Bobbie Goulding in the halves. Saints' try-scorers were Ian Pickavance [2], Paul Loughlin, Adam Fogerty and Sonny Nickle, with Bobbie Goulding also scoring a four-pointer and adding three goals for good measure. What about a 'dream team' of all those guys who have played for both clubs over the years? What about this XIII? It would take some beating! Mose Masoe in the centres – a frightening proposition!

The RFL announces new training sessions and local friendlies as ways of maintaining momentum in Women's Rugby League following the decision not to restart the Coral Women's Challenge Cup and to cancel the Betfred Women's Super League competition in 2020.



RESERVES LEAGUE TO Be shelved for 2020

In consultation with clubs, the RFL has determined that the Reserves League should be cancelled for 2020. Clubs will still be encouraged to play friendly matches, and it is envisaged that the competition will resume in 2021 – with all decisions to be taken in line with Government advice.

The RFL has written to all clubs who were due to be involved in the Academy Championship in 2020, and informed them that the decision has reluctantly been taken to cancel the competition this year. Planning has already begun for the resumption of Scholarships and Academies in 2021.






