VIEW FROM THE CLUB...

JAMES ROBY

The objective last week against Wakefield was to obviously get the two points. We weren't too pleased with the way we played and we know there is a lot of improvement in us. We need to fix up a few things this week and it is almost better we are playing Wakefield again because we can right those wrongs quickly this time around.



Subconsciously, we were aware Wakefield had a few players out and where they sat in the table, but we have an obligation to be professional and approach every game in the same manner regardless of the situation. We were maybe guilty of underestimating them a little bit and the first 20 minutes proved that as we were terrible with the ball. All those negatives make us more accountable and we will look to put this right on Thursday.

I was told after the game I got through 60 tackles last week, but I feel fine! I haven't been playing 80 minutes much this year with Kristian giving me a breather in the last 20 minutes of games with young Aaron Smith and Lewis Dodd getting their chances and it was one of the only times this year I played the full 80. With that comes more tackles and I suppose that is just my job! I felt better on the back of 80 minutes as it shows I have still got it in my legs. It's good for your confidence.

We are heading towards the business end of the season where we will play two or sometimes three games in a week which will be tough, but it is what it is this year. It is the same across the world, things are different and we have just got to get on with it. The games will come thick and fast and a lot of big games towards the back end of the year too. It doesn't change our role. We must win as many games as we can, make the playoffs and ultimately go on and win the Grand Final. If that's the way we have got to do it this year then so be it. I am looking forward to the challenge of it and some teams might use this year as some sort of excuse, but from our point of view we will get on with our job and see where we end up. It is a great challenge both on the field and off it, in terms of managing the protocols. There are a lot more factors that come into play this year and we are all for it.

You're enjoying a good run of games in the first team at the moment?

I am loving it! When we came back from the COVID break, I was waiting for my chance and it was sad Percy [Mark Percival] got injured, but it has given me a chance to get into the team. I am now looking forward to hopefully playing my part in helping get this team to a Grand Final!

How much are you learning playing first team rugby league in comparison to Academy level?

Yes definitely. That is the sign of a good team, you can win when you're not playing well. We are all switching on this week and hopefully we can show what we can do this time around against a good Wakefield side.

A busy few weeks ahead – something you must be looking forward to playing a part in as a player?

Yes, hopefully I can get a few more chances and showcase what I can do on the big stage. I am looking forward to any opportunities that come my way.

What is your long-term aim?

There are a lot of games in a short period this season so there is bound to be a few rotations and hopefully I can play as many games as I can.

A WELCOME TO... **WAKEFIELD TRINITY**

It's Round 15 of Super League XXV and this round of fixtures takes place at the Halliwell Jones Stadium in Warrington. It's a Saints 'home' match and for the second time in a week, we face Wakefield Trinity. This match was originally scheduled for Round 9, but the season's first positive Covid 19 cases at Hull FC saw that round of fixtures rearranged and Saints ended up playing Castleford Tigers, whilst Wakefield faced the Catalans.

Saints are currently top of the Super League table having won 10 of our 13 matches whereas Trinity are bottom of the pile having won just two. Both of those wins were pre lockdown against Warrington Wolves and Salford Red Devils.

Wakefield have assembled a squad that play open attractive rugby and they are a great team to watch. And in young winger, Tom Johnstone they have one of our sports most exciting players. He is a prolific try scorer and he has crossed the whitewash seven times in his ten appearances in 2020. Trinity's first choice 17 are more than a match for any other team but Chris Chester's main problem has been the fitness and availability of his players.

What started as just two Wakefield players that had to stay away from the squad and another one the following week; eventually mushroomed into a further seven players forced to sit out by the end of the month. At times Wakefield have struggled to have 17 players available to play and, after their second match versus Wigan, the club had a five day period when all playing and

coaching staff were asked to isolate to try clear things up. Then, just as it appeared that this had worked, following their trip to Perpignan, in a private plane, a fortnight ago, they had a fresh positive Covid test result and he and a further seven players had to stand down ahead of last week's match versus Saints.

But Trinity are still standing and in this craziest of seasons they are, to their credit continuing to fulfil their fixtures and give their best. They gave St. Helens a real fright, last Friday, and came so close to defeating the league leaders. As they battle to avoid the 'wooden spoon', one good thing in their favour has been the decision to scrap relegation in 2020, thus guaranteeing their Super League status ahead of 2021.

Since the advent of Super League, Saints have faced Wakefield on 49 occasions, winning 40 matches to Wakefield's nine. At Knowsley Road, St. Helens won 12 of their 14 meetings; including a 64-16 win and a 60 points to 4 victory (both in 2005), with Wakefield's 'away' successes being a 16 points to 10 triumph in 2003 and a 22 points to 20 win in 2009. Since Saints moved out of Knowsley Road in 2010, they have beaten Trinity 52-6 at the Halton Stadium, in Widnes, in 2011 and enjoyed nine wins in their 10 matches at the Totally Wicked Stadium (if you include last season's Challenge Cup tie triumph) - with Wakefield's only success coming in 2017 when they defeated Saints 16-12.

TOM JOHNSTONE

Tom is product of Trinity's youth system, and he made his debut in the defeat at Wigan in 2015. The winger went on to make 12 Super League appearances in 2015 scoring nine tries. Tom was named as Super League's Young Player of the Year in 2016. After an injury hit 2017, he was back to his best again in 2018 being named in the Super League Dream Team. Last year he suffered an 'early' season-ending anterior cruciate knee injury that restricted him to just six appearances and in 2020 he has scored seven tries in 10 of Wakefield's matches.



REECE LYNE

The former Hull and Great Britain Academy winger has now established himself as one of the best centres in Super League with his 2018 form seeing initial selection in the England Knights squad; before promotion to the England first team. He made his England debut against France at Leigh in October 2018. Having joined Trinity in 2012, he went on to play 179 games for the club, scoring 52 tries.



DAVID FIFITA

David is a product of the St. Patricks Blacktown Community Rugby Club in Australia. He joined the Cronulla Sharks and made his first team debut on 17th March 2014 versus Canterbury Bulldogs. He made 19 appearances for the Sharks before he moved to Wakefield midway through the 2016 campaign. The former Tongan prop has entered his fourth full season with the club with 85 games behind him, scoring 18 tries. David was having a magnificent 2019 and was a contender for 'Man of Steel' before a foot injury somewhat disrupted both his and Wakefield's season.



MATTY ASHURST

Matty Ashurst is a 2nd Row forward who began his Super League career at St. Helens. He made his Saints' debut versus Salford City Reds in 2009 and went on to make 51 Super League appearances for Saints scoring 8 tries for the club. In 2012 he joined Salford before joining Wakefield in 2015 and he continued with his excellent consistency missing just one game in 2018 and being rewarded with a selection in the 2018 Super League Dream Team. Last season Matty made only 12 appearances due to injury.



JOE WESTERMAN

Joe originally joined Castleford Tigers and made his first team debut in 2007 and went on to win both the Club and League Young Player of the Year awards. Twelve months later he also won the Super League Young Player of the Year Award. Westerman then joined Hull FC in 2011 and spent the next five years in East Yorkshire. After 126 appearances for the club, he departed for Warrington at the end of the 2015 season. Westerman appeared in the 2016 Cup Final against the Black & Whites, but after a short spell at Toronto Wolfpack in 2018, he returned to Hull FC before joining Trinity at the start of this season.

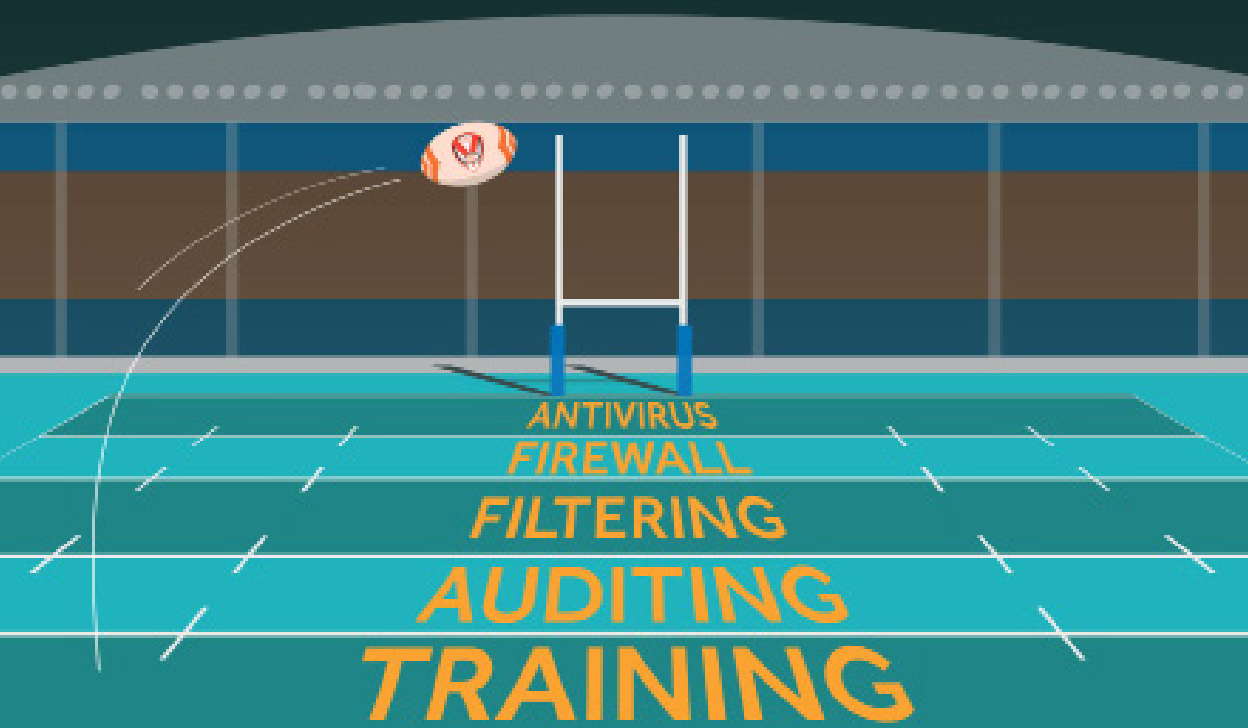

ON THIS DAY: 15 OCTOBER

1932 Vince Karalius, later dubbed the Wild Bull of the Pampas by the somewhat amazed Australian press during the 1958 Great Britain tour, was born in Widnes. He played every match, at whatever level, like it was a shoot-out at the OK Corale.

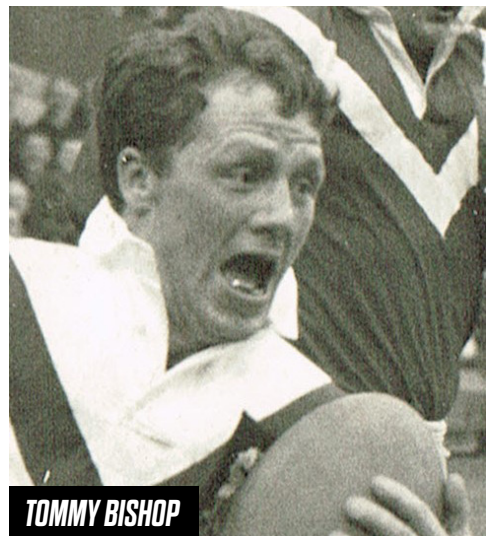
1940 Tommy Bishop, the Mighty Atom scrum-half, [see image] was born in St. Helens. Tommy had a roundabout route via Blackpool Borough and Barrow before he joined his home town club in 1966. He helped the club to four trophies in that season and ended up with selection for the Australasian tour. The Aussies loved him and that's where he ended up, at Cronulla, initially.

1989 First Division: St. Helens 50 Featherstone Rovers 11 at Knowsley Road. One of the highlights was a superb try from New Zealander George Mann on his home debut.

2002 Loose forward Paul Sculthorpe became the first player to retain the prestigious Man of Steel award. He was really in his pomp then. It was little wonder that he later went on to become the sporting face of the Gillette company. A major coup for rugby league at the time.

2010 A memorable evening indeed: the leaving of Knowsley Road Gala Night, hosted by television presenter Gordon Burns from a marquee on the famous turf, during which the club's Greatest 17 were unveiled. So many memories on a night awash with nostalgia – and more than a few pints!

HERITAGE CERTIFICATES

Our Heritage Certificate Open Days at the Totally Wicked Stadium were popular events, where players and families of deceased former players received their certificates and brochures. In the future, it is hoped to host further events, when appropriate. We can't wait!

It was also a chance to bring in memorabilia and produced some fascinating results, such as the impressive collection of [the Late] #790 John Tembey's medals. John enjoyed a great career with Whitehaven initially, before joining the Saints, making 137 appearances and captained the team against Australia in 1963. Born in Kells, his Cumberland cap was a fine tribute to his achievements at county level. John also represented Great Britain at international level. There was also a magnificent photo of the Saints' front-row of the mid 1960s, featuring John Warlow, Bob Dagnall and John Tembey.

#270 Bill Clarey was a well-respected forward in the 1920s who made 270 appearances for the Saints during his ten-year career at Knowsley Road, which included a Wembley appearance in 1930, his last but one game for the club. Bill Clarey [jnr] his son was a proud man indeed when he received his father's Heritage Number certificate.

Just what it means to have played for the Saints was illustrated by #874 Ray Hughes, who travelled up from Broadstairs in Kent to receive his certificate. Although a knee injury hampered his career at Knowsley Road, former Waterloo forward Ray has some great memories of playing and training with some of the 'greats' including Cliff Watson.
