VIEW FROM THE CLUB... KRISTIAN WOOLF

I was really proud of the effort our young blokes came up with on Monday and I thought they did themselves and the Club proud. There was a number of debutants and others who have only played one or two games at this level, but what they had about them is a ton of heart and effort and they certainly put it all on the line and tried really hard. We have got to remember some of those blokes hadn't played any footy whatsoever since March which is even more credit to them. They put themselves in a position to win the game and at the end we probably did everything, but win it! A couple of crucial errors cost us but they will learn from it and will benefit from it

James Graham announced this week that he will be retiring at the end of the season and he deserves all the tributes he gets. He has been a great servant over here and over in Australia and his record in terms of what he has been able to do in both competitions and internationally is terrific. It's been a privilege to work with him over the last few weeks and I wish I had more time with him. His example is the best example any young bloke in our game can follow and I am sad to see it will finish this year, but we can share the end of his career with him and I know the rest of the group want to send him off in a positive way.

This week we also heard the news that two further matches were cancelled. It is an enormous worry. Our main priority is to focus on tonight's match, but unfortunately and this isn't due to anyone's fault, but the competition has now become compromised and it has been compromised in a number of ways. We have got a top four set up and a number of teams still battling for that and the fact of the matter is some teams are going to play as many as 20 games and others will play as many as 15 games and that compromises the competition in itself. Teams that deserve to be playing finals footy, could miss out.

It's something that needs to be looked at, now. It has been branded around that this week could be the last weekend of regular season games and I think that is what has to happen. Otherwise we are going to continue with a compromised competition and it will only become more so. We have got an

opportunity now to get straight into a final series and have some integrity about it. There has been a lot of different ideas tossed around and I don't think you can go to seven or eight teams. We have got an 11-team competition and I can't see how eight of those can go through to finals. I think the original system of five teams would be fair and as things stand we have five teams who realistically all have a chance of playing in the playoffs and I said it is not anyone's fault that some teams can't complete games, so I think that would be fair going forward.



Having said that, we can't focus on anything but tonight's match with Wigan. It is a big game and one our whole squad is really looking forward to. Those players that we didn't play on Monday night, didn't play Friday with this game in mind. It's a top of the table clash, an original derby and we are very aware of it over in Australia too. It is really exciting to be part of and I know our blokes will be at their best tonight and I can't wait to see that.

CAPTAIN JAMES ROBY HAS HIGH PRAISE FOR THE SAINTS YOUNGSTERS, HIS MATE JAMMER AND PREVIEWS TONIGHT'S DERBY!

As captain you must have been proud of the youngsters and debutants' performances against Salford?

I was really proud, they all did great. Any debut is special, but five in one game is brilliant for the players and the Club and the staff who have had an impact on them through the Academy pathway. They didn't look out of place at all and we know what they are capable of as we train with them every day and I told them that before the game. They were really unlucky to lose the game and there was some cruel lessons to learn. I am sure they will have long enough careers to forget about that and put it to bed!

One of those cruel lessons was for debutant Tom Nisbet who knocked on over the try-line. Have had a word with him this week?

There has been a bit of friendly banter going around, but then again everyone has put their arm around him this week! 'Nis' had a great game and he didn't do anything wrong other than that one mistake. You could tell he was gutted after the game and he probably scores that 999 times out of a 1000 and unlucky for him it was on his debut. Everyone makes mistakes and as long as you learn from them that is the main thing. I am sure he will have a good future in the game.

And as a hooker how impressed were you with Josh Eaves' performance?

I thought Evo went brilliant. He is very dependable, a terrier and he will always fight and give it his all. He got his try early doors which will do wonders for his confidence and I thought he had a great game. He took them on, ran the ball well when he had the chance and was ferocious in defence. It's hard for him and some of the other lads who haven't really had any game time because of the situation we are in. We see them working hard every week in training and actually they are the ones who are helping me and some other senior players prepare week on week. They aren't getting the rewards so I am glad Evo, who is very vocal and a leader, got his chance and he took it!

We have to talk about your mate, Jammer's retirement....

What else can we do other than try send him home with another winners ring? It's quite sad really and I am probably going to be in the same position soon. We know it is coming at some point, but it's still hard. Jammers time is nearly here, and I think everything that has been said about him, especially from Eamonn - 'one of the alltime greats' - which he definitely is in my opinion - is a perfect tribute to him. I have grown up with Jammer and I know him as a person. The emotion he carries into his performances, he is a fantastic leader and a great role model for the younger lads. The way his voice carries around any dressing room in the world, and the way he delivers that message as well, I think that is the one thing that is unique with him. He is a rare breed and will be missed. I suppose he will be looking forward to his life after rugby, kicking back and chilling out in his beachside mansion - [laughs!]. He has the three Challenge Cups, but if we can help get him another Grand Final ring this year it will be great!

A massive game! It's been a bit strange this year as you don't know what is coming next with stuff changing all the time. Everyone knows this year is just filled with chaos, but in amongst all that we have been building and building and we are getting closer to the end of the year and then all of a sudden we have this Saints vs Wigan derby with both teams virtually at full strength! We know what it is about, we know the town will be behind us - unfortunately not from the stands. It is the biggest game we have had for a while, if not all year and all the lads are ready and looking forward to it! It could be a battle for the League Leaders' shield too so we know what it at stake and we have spoken about what we want to do this year - and that includes defending our trophies! That has got to start tonight with a BIG performance against Wigan!

AN OPEN LETTER TO THE SPORTS MINISTER NIGEL HUDDLESTON MP FROM THE CEO OF ST. HELENS R. F. C.

Please find below an Open Letter to the Sports Minister Nigel Huddleston MP from Mike Rush, the CEO of St.Helens R.F.C. sent earlier this week. The letter outlines specific and profound challenges faced by St.Helens R.F.C. – the largest employer in Rugby League.

St.Helens R.F.C. are reigning Super League champions. We're proud of that.

We are one of the oldest Rugby League clubs in the country; a local business that has worked hard to ensure that we are well managed, well run and operate as a caring, responsible employer. And we're just as proud of this.

We are a major employer in St Helens. In fact – St Helens Rugby League Club is the biggest employer in Rugby League. We are now managing job losses in our club family – some of which could have been avoided with clearer, consistent, and timely decision making by policy makers – and which will have a profound impact on our town.

The reality of the inconsistency of Government decision making has serious consequences.

We are closed. Closed to events, parties, conferences, lunches and dinners. St.Helens R.F.C. has now lost over £1m in non-match day 'hospitality and events' revenue. This is non-recoverable and is growing materially every day.

The club has accessed CJRS ('furlough') relief where possible and this is welcomed, as it has been at businesses nationwide. The club has already submitted a loan application to Government.

However, as a club which built its own stadium, runs it properly and employs its people directly – we have been prevented from further accessing support that would have been available if the business was structured differently. Whilst navigating the reliefs and mitigations is complicated, the result of this is straightforward – it is the heartbreak of local people losing their jobs.

Despite the fact that the stadium is closed to all but the hosting of behind closed doors games, our business cannot access the 'Closed' Job Support Scheme (JSS). Yet we are a hospitality business.

Due to the fact that we employ all who work here – specifically our catering colleagues - we have been unable to access business



reliefs which are available to outsourced hospitality services. Perversely, we are being discriminated against due to our investment into our business and into our local people. Despite employing scores of local people in catering, events, bar and other hospitality roles – and selling thousands of meals and drinks in an ordinary year - we cannot be classed as a hospitality business. Hospitality businesses have job protection and can access 15% VAT relief. By employing everyone at St.Helens R.F.C. our corporate structure now results in huge disadvantage. And ultimately the loss of more local jobs than may have otherwise been the case.

The new Job Support Scheme was announced three weeks ago. However, there is considerable inconsistency in what has been delivered for 'Open' JSS last week and what formed that initial announcement. In that intervening period as we awaited details (which we now find are quite different from that initial information), we took decisions which impact on people's employment and livelihoods.

Stability and rational decision making are required by all – and this includes policy makers. Businesses simply cannot do the best thing by their employees when given

little or no notice of fundamental changes. This is not abstract. This is real people losing their employment through no fault of their own, in a town where jobs are extremely difficult to find and mental health and other health inequalities are some of the most challenging in the country. It is extremely serious and as a club we are heart broken.

The club appreciates the continued support of local MP's – Marie Rimmer MP and Conor McGinn MP. Whilst we are grateful that the club will receive a grant via St Helens Council from the Liverpool City Region Business Recovery Fund, that is dwarfed by the size of the challenge we face to protect our hospitality colleagues' roles.

The Chancellor has said 'we cannot save every job'. Sadly, we all know that is probably right. But where a good employer is fighting tooth and nail to save them and jobs are being lost due to inflexibility, inconsistent categorisation of businesses, and last-minute changes in Government schemes – we have to speak out. Lives and livelihoods are literally at stake.

A WELCOME TO... IN CAR WARRIORS WIGAN WARRIORS

The eyes of the rugby league world turn once again to St. Helens this week as our Round 18 fixture against derby rivals Wigan Warriors takes place at our Totally Wicked Stadium home.

It's 1st against 2nd and thanks to Saints narrow defeat to Salford, at Leeds, on Monday night, the winners of this evening's encounter will top the table with just three regular season rounds remaining. Wigan have won 11 of their 15 Super League matches so far this season. They have accumulated 22 points and have a win percentage of 73.33%. They trail St. Helens by 2 points and have a game in hand on the Saints, who have a win percentage of 75%.

The Warriors are having a good season and head coach, Adrian Lam can be pleased with his team's progress. In 2019, Wigan failed to win any silverware and although they ended the regular season in 2nd position, they were a record 16 points behind St. Helens.

After a shaky start to 2019, the first signs of Lam's positive influence on his team occurred mid-season; in June, when Wigan were, at that time, in 9th position in the table, with just six wins from their opening 17 matches. During the remainder of the campaign, aided by the signing of Bevan French, the Warriors picked themselves up to win 12 of their remaining 13 matches to end their campaign in 2nd place. They were to lose both of their play-off games though to end the season empty handed.

During the off season, reigning Man of Steel, Jackson Hastings joined the club along with Jake Bibby from Salford, Mitch Clark was recruited from Castleford and George Burgess was signed from South Sydney in the NRL. Wigan have occupied one of the top two positions in the table all year and despite the craziness of 2020, they have been a constant. In

Bevan French, Zak Hardaker, Jackson Hastings and Liam Farrell, Wigan possess four of the standout players in the competition and they must fancy their chances of reaching the Grand Final at the KCOM Stadium in Hull.

For the record, Wigan's Super League results during 2020 have been, (pre lock down) – Warrington Wolves (H) W16-10, Castleford Tigers (A) L12-16, Hull FC (H) W26-12, Huddersfield Giants (A) W42-10, Hull KR (H) W30-16 and Salford Red Devils (A) L14-18; (post lock down) – Wakefield Trinity (A*) W23-22, Leeds Rhinos (H*) W28-10, Castleford Tigers (H*) W30-22, Hull KR (A*) L18-34, Catalans Dragons (A) W28-12, Wakefield Trinity (H*) W28-16, St. Helens (H*) L0-42, Warrington Wolves (A*) W18-14 and Salford Red Devils (H*) W58-12. In the Challenge Cup, Wigan's results were, Hull FC, QF, (A*) W36-4 and Leeds Rhinos, SF, (N*) L12-26. (*) - Matches have been played at neutral venues.

In the 69 previous Super League clashes between these two arch rivals, Saints have won 33 matches to the Warriors 32; with four games having ending in draws. In the twenty-one Cup ties and Play Off clashes, during this period, St. Helens have 11 successes to the Cherry and Whites 10 triumphs, with Wigan winning four of the seven major Finals that the two clubs have contested.

This is St. Helens against Wigan! Playing behind closed doors has become the norm during 2020, but it's still so strange for a Saints and Wigan encounter. With so many of the games' top quality players on show, the outcome of this game is a hard one to call. Saints have won the last five matches between the two teams, but at kick off time tonight, that counts for absolutely nothing! This one will be decided in the next 80 minutes!

ZAK HARDAKER

Zaki sa versatile player who is equally at home at full back, centure or wing. He has previously played for Featherstone Rovers, Leeds Phinos, Penrith Planthers and Castleford Tigers. At Leeds he was a Grand Final winner on three occasions in 2011, 2012 and 2015, a double forhallerge Cup winner in 2014 and 2015 and who the League Leaders' Shield in 2015. He was Super League Young Player of the Year in 2012 and Super Man of Steel in 2015. In 2019 he joined the Warriors, had an impressive campaign and was selected on the Great Britain Lions Tour of NZ and PNA.



BEVAN FRENCH

Bevan joined Wigan Warriors from Parnamatta Eels in July 2019 and is contracted to the club until 2022. Born in Tingha, NSW, French is of Indigenous Australian descent and played his junior rugby league for Tingha Tilgers RLFC. A noted finisher, he made 47 appearances for the Parnamatta Eels, scoring 35 tries. Very much in the Jason Robinson mould, Bevan is renowned for his electric pace and dancing feet and can play at either half back or in the three quarters. He is the nephew of former Australian international and St George Illewarra Dragons and Hull FC winger Nathan Blacklock and he also represented the Indigenous All Stars in 2017. He made his debut for Wigan from the bench in the 36-18 win over Hull KR at the DW Stadium on 9th August and scored a try on his first start for the club a week later in the victory against Warrington Webes.



JACKSON HASTINGS

Jackson is the son of Sydney
Roosters legend Kevin Hastings
and was an Illawarra junior. He
represented NSW at Under 16s and
Under 18s level and was selected
for the Australian Schoolboys.
Hastings, a highly talented half back,
played for the Sydney Roosters and
the Manly Sea Eagles in the NRL
prior to joining Salford Red Devils in
July 2018. A huge crowd favourite,
Jackson was outstanding in 2019
and heiped an unfancied Salford
team reach the Super League
Grand Final for the very first time
and was named Super League Man
of Steel, earning selection for the
Great Britain Lions Tour. Joining
Wigan at the start of 2020, he is one
of the Warriors 'danger men' tonight.



LIAM FARRELL

A product of the Wigan Academy, Liam made a try scoring ist Team debut versus Wakerleid Trinity in 2010. A distant cousin of former Wigan skipper Andy Farrell and brother to ex Wigan team mate Connor, Liam is one the game's top Second Row forwards. He was a Challenge Cup winner in 2011 and 2013 and has won the Super League Grand Final in 2010, 2013, 2016 and 2018. Liam is consistent and dependable and his one of the best defenders in the league. His skills were rewarded by him playing twice for England in the 2014 World Cup and, he was an ever present in the 2014 Por Vations Series. A member of the 2015 Dream Team, Liam won the Harry Sunderland Trophy in the 2016 Trand Team, Liam won the Harry Sunderland Trophy in the 2016 Trand Final and helped Vigan win the 2017 World Club Challence.



JOE GREENWOOD

Joe played his junior rugby with the Saddleworth Rangers ARLPC in Oldham. He joined the St. Helens Academy and developed into a strong running Secord Row forward He made his Saints debut in April 2012 versus Oldham and went on to make 77 appearances for the club, scoring 26 tries. He became one of the best line breaking back row forwards in Super League. Early on in 2017 he pianed Gold Coast Titans in Australia prior to signing for the Warriors in June 2018. He played in the 2018 Grand Final win sv Warrington Wolves. He was called up to the England Squad for the 2018 international three-match series against NZ and he was named in the 17-man squad for Englands third Test against the Kniks at Elland Road, where he made his international debut. Joe went on to play scoring seven tries and earning selection for the England Knights Squad.



1933 David Gamble, from the chemical-manufacturing family [see pic] was one who played in the very first match for the newly-formed St. Helens RFC in 1974, a twenty-a-side game against Liverpool Royal Infirmary, early in 1874 at Boundary Road. He was one of 13 forwards! David passed away on this day aged 71 and left a sum of over £92,000 in his Will. After his early exploits in the scrums, you could say that he was certainly one of the most well-heeled Saints!


1954 Northern Rugby League: Widnes 2 St Helens 8 at Naughton Park. Flying winger Frank Carlton and Aussie loose forward Max Garbler notched Saints' tries, with stand-off Peter Metcalfe booting over a two point conversion.

1977 Northern Rugby League: Featherstone Rovers 5 St Helens 12 at Post Office Road. Late October always seemed the time we played against the Yorkshiremen! Saints' pulled off a competent victory against traditionally tough opposition, with tries from Eddie Cunningham, Dave Chisnall and Harry Pinner, who also added a drop-goal. Geoff Pimblett booted over a conversion.


1983 Slalom Lager Championship: St Helens 19 Featherstone Rovers 13 at Knowsley Road. A hard-earned victory against relegation threatened Rovers. Saints' tries came from Peter Gorley, Brian Parkes and Neil Holding. Full-back Steve Rule booted over 3 goals, with Harry Pinner chiming in with a drop-goal, as he so often did!


Since we are playing our good friends from Wigan today, what about a 'Played for Both' XIII to take on the world? Coached by Jim Sullivan, of course:

ST.HELENS R.F.C. AWARD HERITAGE NUMBER CERTIFICATES

From Nijmegen to Nutgrove!

The power of the internet! Dave Dooley of Saints Heritage Society fielded an unusual request from the Netherlands in the spring that led to an incredible story unfolding in our search for the relatives of deceased former Saints' players.

The e-mail was from a lady called Nienke Noijen, from Nijmegen, who has been writing about Second World War victims in her area, starting with the famous Irish Guards Regiment. Her daughter. Pleun, was born on 25th October 2017. Nienke first adopted a name from the Holocaust memorial In Amsterdam, to help finance the project and duly chose a name from the memorial with the same date. Yet she wanted to remember another victim of the terrible conflict, closer to home with that 25th October date as a further link. "So we went to the Military Cemetery at nearby Jonkerbos," she explained, "and searched for our own hero. Patrick Dullard, of the Irish Guards, was the one whose death fitted our date criteria. So, every 25th October, we light three candles: one for my daughter's birthday, one for our holocaust victim and one for Patrick."

She had searched the web for any information and came upon a reference to Patrick Dullard, a hooker for St Helens RFC in the mid-1930s, on

the Saints Heritage site. As part of Operation Market Garden, Lance Sergeant 2716800 Patrick Dullard found himself in the thick of the action to secure the town of Nijmegen from the Germans. Tragically, he died in action on the 25th October 1944 and is buried in Jonkerbos War Cemetery.

As a result, Saints' Heritage Society managed to contact Patrick's daughter, Helen Coakley, a St Helens resident, who was, quite understandably, amazed that this connection had been made. She has visited her father's final resting place in the past and is immensely proud that his sacrifice will not be forgotten. Helen immediately got in touch with Nienke and a bond of friendship has ensued. "She sent me a lovely birthday card and a picture of the flower she put on my father's grave," says a delighted Helen. "And a lovely box of biscuits toothey were delicious!"

Helen was recently presented with her father's Heritage Number Certificate [#445] and a copy was sent to the Netherlands, where Nienke and daughter Pleun were delighted to receive it! The last words are with Nienke: "Pleun's birthday will be extra special because this time we now know something about Patrick. Last year he was just our unknown hero, so we'll light the candle with a very warm feeling."
