WE CAUGHT UP WITH THE BOSS TO REFLECT ON A BUSY FEW WEEKS' AT THE CLUB AND LOOK AHEAD TO THIS EVENING'S SEMI FINAL CLASH!

LMS and Kyle Amor recently signed new deals at the Club ahead of next year...

The squad will be a little bit younger next year and both Louie and Kyle will be valuable for us. Their experience and longevity in the game will be crucial for the young blokes coming through. They also like playing together, are great around the place and will make an impact for us on the field.

And so have young Morgan Knowles and Matty Lees...

Those two guys along with James Bentley who we re-signed earlier in the year are the future of the Club. They are all tough and uncompromising and work really hard and want to improve. They are the future and have their best footy ahead of them.

We also have two more new faces coming in too in Iggy Paasi and Sione Mata'utia....What will they bring to the group?

Both will bring a lot to us next season. Iggy is a big body and his best attribute is the way he can carry the footy and he is really smart as well. He knows how to use his skill set and I have coached him before so I know what to expect from him. He stands up when it gets tough.

Sione is a player I had the privilege of coaching last year at Newcastle Knights and he is a terrific character and has some real leadership qualities. On the field we see him as a back rower and he has a real good attacking skill set, leg speed and a powerful carry. He is a strong defender and for a 24 year old bloke he has played over 120 NRL first grade games which is great experience.

How has the camp been in last two weeks with no games?

It has been good to have a couple of weeks off given the hectic season. Although there has been interruption there has been a lot of short turnarounds and lots going on in general. We have been able to freshen up and I think the players will show that tonight – they will arrive fresh and feeling confident coming into this game.

Catalans were impressive against Leeds weren't they. They also looked fresh...

I thought they did a real good job and the first 20 minutes saw them start with a good intensity and that caught Leeds by surprise. I think both play-off games have been high intensity and high energy games and that is what finals footy is. They were both real high quality too and I am expecting the same game tonight. That high energy, back and forth sort of footy is what we thrive on and I can't wait for our guys to get out there because I know they are chomping at the bit and it's the time of the year you get your best footy and I am looking forward to that.

What game plan are you expecting from Catalans tonight?

They will arrive with the same blueprint that was successful for them last week and that is how they have approached finals in the past. I don't think the disciplinary matters changes that. Yes, you want your best players playing, but whoever they throw out, it is a big occasion and they will be at their best and we are going to be at our best too. It's going to be a great game of footy!

James Graham will make his final appearance at the Totally Wicked Stadium tonight. Are occasions like this made for him?

Yes definitely. He has got all the accolades he has got in the game because of what he has done over such a long period and what he has been able to do in big games like this. His experience is going to be invaluable and he isn't the only one either. Jammer knows he hasn't got long left in his career and what we know we are going to get is every bit of passion, effort and the best he can give this weekend and if we win, in the Grand Final too. Everyone knows he is retiring, and everyone wants to send him and our other departing Saints out on a high because they all deserve it.



A WELCOME TO... CATALANS DRAGONS

Super League XXV will go down in the history books as Rugby League's most difficult campaign. Never, in the game's 125 year history, has the sport had to overcome such huge hurdles to simply survive. There have been several times, this season, when there was a real possibility that competition wasn't going to be completed, but tonight, to everyone's credit, we reach the Play Off Semi Final as St.Helens host Catalans Dragons with the winner qualifying for next Friday's Grand Final, at the KCOM Stadium, Hull.

The Dragons entered the 2020 season full of confidence. They were very shrewd in the transfer market and in signing James Maloney and Israel Folau they announced their intentions to challenge for the main honours during 2020. With Josh Drinkwater returning to the club to partner Maloney in the halves, and the acquisition of Wigan flyer, Tom Davies and Hull KR skipper, Joel Tomkins they also added excellent leadership skills to their squad and they quite were rightly seen as being amongst the competition favourites.

The Dragons came into the current campaign looking for stability and continual improvement. They understand that they face far more challenges and travel than other club and they know they have to face up these challenges and embrace them with a very strong and focussed team ethic.

They played just four matches ahead of Covid-19 pandemic. They won three of these games were in 5th place in the table. In the 16 weeks since lock down they have played nine league games, two Challenge Cup ties and tonight's match will be their second Play Off game. These figures don't tell the whole story. The Catalans have played only three of these matches in France. The club has been completely stood down on two occasions, for blocks of two weeks and ten days, and during these periods they were static - completely unable to train, as well as play due to Covid-19 protocols. On each occasion they have had to recommence from effectively a standing start, and that has made things particularly tough for them. So credit has to be given to their perseverance and tenacity and they have fully deserved their place in the Semi Finals.

The Dragons qualified for the Play Offs by finishing the regular season in 4th position on the Super League ladder. They played 13 matches; winning eight of them; giving them a total of 16 points. That gave the Dragons a win percentage of 61.54%. They finished above both Leeds Rhinos and Hull FC, despite having fewer competition points because their win percentage was higher.

For the record, the Catalans' Super League results during 2020 have been, (pre lock down) – Huddersfield Giants (H) L12-32, Castleford Tigers (H) W36-18, Hull FC (A) W34-29 and Salford Red Devils (H) W30-14; (post lock down) – St. Helens (A*) L6-34, Castleford Tigers (A*) W40-10, Wakefield Trinity (A*) W58-0, Wigan Warriors (H) L12-28, Warrington Wolves (A) L16-30, Leeds Rhinos (A) W34-6, Wakefield Trinity (H) W40-8, Hull KR (H) W34-4 and Salford Red Devils (A) L24-42. In the Challenge Cup, the Dragons' results were, Wakefield Trinity, Rd 6, (H*) W36-24 and Salford Red Devils, QF, (H*) L18-22; and in last week's Play Off, Leeds Rhinos, PO, (H*) W26-14. (*) - Matches have been played at neutral venues.

All pointers suggest that tonight's match should be a cracker. The Dragons will be full of confidence after last week's defeat of, Challenge Cup winners, Leeds Rhinos in a very physical Play Off match. The last time Saints and the Dragons met in a major Semi Final, it was a Challenge Cup tie at Bolton in 2018 and the Catalans beat a very good St. Helens team, en-route to going on to win the Cup, so there's little chance of any complacency tonight by the Saints.

Since their introduction into Super League in 2006, St. Helens have played host to the Dragons on 19 occasions. Saints have won 14 of these matches including a 40 points to 18 victory at the Stobart Stadium in Widnes in 2011 and a 34-6 triumph at Headingley, Leeds, earlier this season. At the Totally Wicked Stadium, the Catalans triumphed on their first two visits; in 2012 and 2013 and again early in 2017. At Knowsley Road, St. Helens won five of their seven encounters including victory in two Challenge Cup ties.

SAM TOMKINS

Sam joined the Catalans at the start of last season. A product of the Wigan Academy system, he soon became a first team regular and was voted Super League's 'Young Player' of the Year in 2009 & 2010. He was also named in five successive 'Dream Teams' from 2009 to 2013 and was voted 'Man of Steel' in 2012. He represented England in the 2013 World Cup and in Four Nations Series in 2009, 2010, 2011 & 2014. In 2011 and played Rugby Union for the Barbarians. Tomkins played two years in the NRL with the New Zealand Warriors before returning to Wigan in 2016. After missing much of 2017 due to injury he is now back to his best form.



TOM DAVIES

Tom Davies was Steve McNamara's fourth recruit for the 2020 season. The 22-year-old England winger signed a two-year deal. Born and trained at Wigan, he made his Super League debut in 2017 and was named Young Player of the Year. He also earned his first caps for the England Knights that year. A Super League champion in 2018, he scored a try in the Grand Final win over Warrington. A serious ankle injury on the Warriors wing ended his season in April 2018, but he made a strong impression against the Dragons in April 2018 where he recorded 309 metres, the second-best performance in Super League history. In 2020, Tom has a total of 13 tries – the second highest in the competition.



JOSH DRINKWATER

The Australian playmaker is back at the club after a season at Hull KR. Trained at Manly, he made his NRL debut for the St George Illewarra Dragons in 2013 before joining London Broncos the following season. Having spent time with the NRL club Wests Tigers and then Leigh Centurions, he signed with the Catalans during 2018 where he became a stand-out performer and helped the club win the Challenge Cup. He finally left Perpignan at the end of that season and signed with Hull KR for 2019. Josh returned to the Dragons ahead of the 2020 season and has gone on to form a great partnership in the halves with James Maloney.



REMI CASTY

In 2019, Remi made his 300th appearance for the Dragons. He became the first French player in history to be named in the Super League Dream Team in 2012, and he repeated this feat six years later. A Dragon since 2006, he has been a cornerstone of their pack and he returned to the Catalans after a season in the NRL at the Sydney Roosters. He played twelve games in the NRL in the 2014 season, during which he won the helped the Roosters win the Minor Premiership. Remi is a big solid prop forward who has played in eighteen matches for France and was the Dragons' skipper at Wembley in 2018 when the Catalans won the Challenge Cup.



MATT WHITLEY

Recruited last season, the young second row has now confirmed the hopes placed in him. At only 24 years old, he has cemented his place in the Dragons' squad, scoring six tries in 25 games in his first season in Catalonia. Born in St Helens, he joined the Widnes Academy at a very young age. He made his Super League debut for Widnes in 2015 and he went on to score 13 tries in 76 Super League games for the Vikings. A member of the England Knights, he was unfortunately unable to take his place on their autumn tour due to a shoulder injury sustained at the end of the season.



ON THIS DAY: 20TH NOVEMBER

1914 Northern Rugby League: St. Helens 26 Dewsbury 16 at Knowsley Road. This game marked the debut of scrum-half James Peters, a former England RU international, of Afro-Carribean descent [see image]. James had joined the Saints after a spell at Barrow but played just two matches. He was originally a circus bareback rider, whose father died in a lion's cage! Follow that!

1926 Lancashire Cup final: St. Helens 10 St. Helens Recreation 2 at Wilderspool Stadium, Warrington. A landmark moment: Saints' first-ever major trophy triumph. This 'derby' clash in the pouring rain and cloying mud was essentially settled in the first half, with tries from winger Alf Ellaby and stand-off Leslie Fairclough, who danced around Recs' second-rower Albert Fildes to score under the posts! Centre George Lewis kicked 2 goals.

1961 Representative match: Rugby League XIII 22 New Zealand 20 at White City Stadium, Manchester. Tom van Vollenhoven was on the right wing; Warrington's Brian Bevan [2 tries] on the other. For the Kiwis, Ken McCracken was in the centre, father of Jarrod, who played for the Saints in 1992-93.



1989 First Division: Hull 24 St. Helens 34 at the Boulevard. A try and 5 goals for Great Britain centre Paul Loughlin, but the star of the show was hooker Paul 'Kit Kat' Groves with a stunning hat-trick of touchdowns.

A trip down memory lane as we recall the Saints' team that played in the first

Super League match against Catalans Dragons at the Aimee Giral stadium, Perpignan on 17th April 2006. Only James Roby and James Graham remain in the red vee today from that memorable 34-20 victory:



Tom Ellard, who passed away on 8th November aged 87, was on the Board at St Helens RFC for over two decades. His tenure began in the early 1980s, in a time of transition on the playing front, with the end of the Dad's Army team and re-building of the squad a necessity. Initially, he made up a Board of twelve; Tom Ashcroft was Chairman, John Clegg was Vice-Chairman. Apart from Tom, other members included Harry Cook, Eric Ashton MBE, Eric Latham, Bill Lyon, Joe Pickavance, Lawrie Prescott, Bill Rigby and Joe Seddon. Geoff Sutcliffe was Secretary, with Billy Benyon as Coach.

By the time he had resigned his Directorship, in the early Noughties, he had witnessed great changes both on the field and off it, as the game had moved towards a Summer season and full-time professionalism ensued. He succeeded Eric Ashton as Chairman and was involved with the first projects to move away from Knowsley Road to a new purpose-built stadium provisionally sited on the M62 Linkway. He set up a Consultancy Committee, which included supporters, to look into the viability of the project. During his tenure, Ellery Hanley was also appointed as Coach and his team triumphed in the 1999 Grand Final against Bradford Bulls on that memorable night at Old Trafford.

A Primary Headteacher in Widnes, at St Bedes, one of his – and the Board's – most difficult assignments was to strengthen the playing squad in the early 1990s when the club was vying toe to toe with the likes of Wigan and Widnes in the race for major honours. Former Saint Tony

Barrow wrote on social media: "Tom had a big input in the signing of Chris Joynt, Tommy Martyn and many more of the players of the '90s." Yet Tom's particular interest was investment in local rugby talent. "He was always on the A team bus, with Mal Kay," remembers former Kitman Bill Bates, "and he would follow up reports from the club scouts like Harry Wellens and Jack Coatsworth to sign players for the Saints."

Life could be quite dramatic for Board members and Roger Grime, of St Helens Schools Rugby League recalls that Tom was a fund of stories about his times at the club, especially when Sonny Nickle had to stay at his house overnight, such was the fear of him signing for one of Saints' rivals. Shades of one of his predecessors, Joe Harrison, who did the same with a teenaged prodigy called Alex Murphy!

Tom was a quiet and amiable man, who always had time for the supporters and could be seen regularly in the 'Best Stand' paddock watching the Academy or A teams, even before his time on the Board. In fact, as Ian Cartwright recalls, he was a member of the Supporters' Club in the 1970s, before he became involved at Boardroom level and obviously had a real affection for St Helens RFC.
