

SAINTS CASHDASH HALF-TIME DRAW LOTTERY – RULES.

1. Saints Cashdash Half-Time Draw Lottery
 - 1.1 The lottery is operated in accordance with the Gambling Act 2005, and is registered with the Gambling Commission.
 - 1.2 A society is registered to operate the scheme; St Helens Development Association Society, Langtree Park, McManus Drive, St Helens WA9 3AL. The draw is held at home matches, and the winning numbers announced and published soon thereafter on all club media channels.
2. Prizes
 - 2.1 Prizes are determined by the Promoting Society, and are notified both by club media channels and the sales staff.
 - 2.2 Only participants who have paid their stake money will be entitled to win a prize.
 - 2.3 50% of the gross stake money, once expenses have been deducted, will constitute the prize fund.
 - 2.4 No individual prize will exceed £1000. If the prize fund is higher than £1000, an additional ticket will be drawn to account for the remaining prize money.
 - 2.5 Any additional non-cash prizes will be advertised and recorded in accordance with Rule 4.2.
3. Participants
 - 3.1 Participants must be aged 16 years of age or over. It will be necessary for this to be verified before entry is accepted.
 - 3.2 Entry is £1 per ticket and may be paid in cash in person. Alternatively, entry may be made by telephone or the website using a UK registered credit or debit card.
 - 3.3 Participants must not be registered for Self-Exclusion from gambling.
 - 3.4 The Promoting Society withholds the right to deny participants to enter the lottery if they are deemed to be in a vulnerable group, as defined by the Gambling Commission, and implemented by internal policies and procedures.
4. Operation Of Draw
 - 4.1 The draw is conducted on the pitch at half-time, unless circumstances beyond the Promoter's control prevent this.
 - 4.2 Prizes are allocated in the order in which they are drawn. The Promoter ensures that this process is conducted with due propriety.
 - 4.3 All efforts are made to ensure that different people witness the draw process, including members of the public, to ensure the integrity of the operation.
 - 4.4 Winning ticket numbers are immediately announced over the public address system, and subsequently published on the Saints website and in the match programme.
5. Remote Entries via Internet & Telephone
 - 5.1 All entries are treated equally, irrespective of the route of entry, or the method of payment used.

- 5.2 Age verification checks are conducted to ensure that remote entries are compliant with policies and procedures that ensure compliance with the Gambling Act 2005.
- 5.3 All remote entries must be received in line with processing dates. If an entry is either received late, or insufficient time exists to process the payment in time for the current draw, the entry will be submitted for the next available draw.
- 5.4 All remote entries, once confirmed, will receive a document informing the customer of the price of their purchase, details of the draw entered, and details if the promoting society.

6. Dispute Resolution

- 6.1 Any complaints or claims against the lottery should be notified, in writing, to the lottery management in the first instance. Should this fail to achieve a resolution, a complaint may be made to IBAS (Independent Betting Adjudication Service).
- 6.2 As members of the Lotteries Council, any alleged breach of standards would be referred to the Code of Conduct Committee of the Lotteries Council.
- 6.3 Any complaints or claims against the St Helens Development Association Society place no obligation on St Helens Rugby Football Club or its affiliates to act to resolve the dispute, unless any direct claim against these organisations is made.
